This year's charity motorcycle ride will cover nearly 1,300 miles, with daily stops at military memorials along the way.

The 2015 American Legion Legacy Run included daily stops for wreath-laying ceremonies at U.S. military memorials along the route. This year's participants can expect nothing less in 2016.

Department of Virginia Legionnaire Bob Sussan, the ride's chief road captain, helped design this year's route with memorial stops in mind. As chairman of the American Legion Riders Advisory Committee, Sussan said that last year's participants were overwhelmingly in support of such detours.

"We've made it very veteran-centric," Sussan said. "Last year was, I think, the turning point to that. We do a wreath-laying every day. We visit exclusively (Legion) posts for lunch and dinner along the way. It's really changed.

"What we're trying to do ... is get as many veteran events involved as we can. We actually formed an honor guard on the Legacy Run. We have one rider who started re-practicing blowing the bugle, and he blows the bugle for us."

Highlights this year will include stops at the national cemetery in Hopkinsville, Ky.; the Wilson County Veterans Memorial & Museum in Lebanon, Tenn.; and the Veterans Memorial at Bay Tree Park in Red Bay, Ala.


This year's ride, again sponsored by USAA, will travel nearly 1,300 miles through Indiana, Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Ohio. The run will depart Kenneth N. Dowden Wayne Post 64 in Indianapolis at 9 a.m. Aug. 21 and conclude Aug. 25 at Yeager-Benson Memorial Post 199 in Harrison, Ohio, on the eve of the 98th American Legion National Convention in Cincinnati. From Aug. 25-28, Post 199 and other Ohio Rider chapters will host events, meals and runs.

The 2015 Legacy Run raised over \$1.2 million for the American Legion Legacy Fund, which provides college scholarships for the children of U.S. servicemembers who died while on active duty on or after 9/11, as well as to children of post-9/11 veterans with VA disability ratings of 50 percent or higher.

In 10 years, the Legacy Run has helped raise more than \$6 million for the fund.

NAPERVILLE STUDENTS EXCEL AT ILLINOIS BOYS STATE

Naperville's American Legion Post 43 sent twenty-four students from Naperville North. Waubonsie Valley, Nequa Valley. Metea Valley. Benet and St. Francis High Schools to the 81st Annual Session of Illinois Premier Boys State, held



at Eastern Illinois University from June 11th – 17th.

Boys State, a week-long program of citizenship training sponsored by the American Legion, was originated by the Department of Illinois in 1934 and adopted by the national organization in 1935. The Illinois program attracts five hundred boys in the summer before their senior year in high school.

Attendees, known as citizens, are formed into eight counties and twenty-three cities. They attend seminars on the executive, legislative and judicial branches of government, the electoral process, lobbying, meetings, elections, media productions and leadership. They form a band, militia, and police force, participate in athletic activities; and most importantly, learn hands-on government by forming political parties and running for city, county and state elective offices. For all intent and purposes, Illinois Boys State is a mythical fifty-first state with a constitution and body of law run by the attendees. It is often referred to as "A Week That Shapes a Lifetime."

The Naperville students excelled by winning six state-level offices: Lt. Governor, Archit Dhar, Secretary Of State, Tejas Gajula, Comptroller, Bernie Wang, Treasurer, Josh Patel, President pro-tem of the Senate, Shawn Park and Speaker of the House of Representatives, Doug McKissick.

Doug McKissick won a \$2,000 John Geiger Leadership Scholarship; Alexander Shura a \$2,000 Lincoln Oration Contest, (Archit Dhar was the runner-up), and Alexander Shura won a \$1,000 Samsung Scholarship and the right to compete with other state winners for several national scholarships. Chailuv Godwani placed 3rd in the Joe McCraith Model Citizen contest, and Josh Patel was 2nd, Archit Dhar 3^{rd,} in running for the Paul Brown Leadership Award




