If you have wondered about the importance of your DD-214, the attached link will get you to the VA - U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs which helps to provide the details and benefits your family will receive if you file a claim...WITHIN 2 YEARS OF VETERANS DEATH. See the link provided below for the explanation of your benefits.

The over-riding importance, however, you must have the DD-214 (or final discharge papers, if prior to DD-214) to request the benefits. Advise your family where your discharge papers are stored; and/or have a copy of your DD-214 (Discharge Documents) on file with Post 43.

This website describes veteran burial allowance/payments to the veterans family or "next of kin."

We also want to thank Doug and his wife Terry for inviting us to a wonderful service honoring veterans at Springbrook Community Church in Plainfield, IL. The guest speaker was a medically discharged soldier who was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for his actions in combat and we were honored to spend some time speaking to him after the services.

Also in May many Riders participated in the Post 43 Poppy sales and, on Memorial Day, we placed flags on Veteran's grave sites in honor of their service. The Riders also rode in the annual Naperville Memorial Day Parade, in which our own Doug Deetjen was the Grand Marshall. We also attended other Memorial Day ceremonies in the Naperville area.

In June we attended the Little League games of our Post 43 sponsored teams. At the first game we prepared popcorn and brought water, which was given to fans of both teams (thanks to Bob and Sue Burch for getting the popcorn and for getting it bagged). At this game we also had a ceremony where we explained what the Legion stood for and then we presented each player and coaches on both teams with an American Flag lapel pin. The Pledge of Allegiance was then recited by all, which was followed by the singing of the National Anthem by Rider Hugh Wallace. The Riders were so warmly greeted by the fans and players at the game. Everyone, players and fans, were coming up to us and thanking us for our service. It was a wonderful event. 


