## COMMANDER'S CALL

Greetings Fellow Legionaries:

It is an honor to be your commander and I look forward to working with you over the next 12 months to advance the cause for Veterans, National Security, Americanism, and Youth. I have learned a ton over the Summer and wanted to share just a tad with you this month.

At a new office building I greeted the security guard and when he responded with, "squared away!" I asked and confirmed he was a Veteran. I asked if he was a member of the American Legion and he responded with a question, "Why should I join the American

Legion?" I want to arm each and everyone of you with the answer, as I now see it. Of course, you can give your own, but if you're not quite sure why, then tell anyone who asks why: "to help fellow Veterans and our National security".

We have 4 pillars, and I'll address each during the next year, but when a regular guy can dream up and type up a resolution that is forwarded to the National leadership of the American Legion, resolving that they should do something regarding National policy, well that is a big deal.

I know of 2 folks who have done that: Dick Komarek submitted a resolution to have the National leadership meet with Congressional representatives, both house and senate, to recommend they pass a law to pay for the protection of our electrical grid. With the events of July 13 in Manhattan, when the West side of Manhattan's electrical grid failed, and they experienced a blackout. Derek Blumke, a 38 year old former Air Force Electrician wrote 2 resolutions, one in the American Legion and one in the Veterans of Foreign Wars resolving that both organizations should demand an investigation of the VA hospital system due to the over 500% increase in prescription anti-depressants, that parallels the increase in Veterans suicides. I believe both will pass, but even if they don't, the conversations these 2 Veterans have created is commendable.

Now I don't believe every member should be writing resolutions, that is only one option. However, by paying \$40 a year, resources for the platforms for work to benefit our National security and our fellow Veterans are created. So when someone responds to you with, "Why should I join the Legion". Respond to them with: "to help fellow Veterans and our National Security". Again, I'll discuss Youth and Americanism at a later date.

the current membership form, Simply write "Other Conflicts" in the era served portion. The Legion Act was hard fought and recognizes the American Legion's founding fathers belief that "a Veteran is a Veteran" regardless of overseas service or period served. Please encourage those that may not have been able to join in the past to consider membership now!

This also affects Sons of the American Legion (SAL) membership and American Legion Auxiliary membership. Sons and grandsons of living American Legion members are eligible and also sons and grandsons of deceased Veterans who were not American Legion members (the Veteran only needs to have served and been honorably discharged). For Auxiliary membership, this also includes mothers, daughters, and grand-daughters of Veterans meeting the same criteria above (related to a current living Legion member or related to a deceased eligible Veteran). So reach out to those relatives of Veterans and get them involved!

This is an incredible opportunity for honorably discharged Veterans from every era as well as their family members to join the American Legion Family!

As always, if you have someone who is eligible, but you're not sure how to approach them or what to say, let me know! I would love to share with them the value and all of the benefits that come with membership in the American Legion! And if you're not motivated enough to recruit new Legion, SAL, and Auxiliary members, I'll sweeten the pot! Whoever recruits the most members between September 1st and March 31st, 2020, will receive a **\$100 gift card** to the fantastic Hugo's Frog Bar and Fish House! On Monday, 5 August, many members also attended the OPUS "Salute Honor and Love" concert at North Central College. The attendees said the concert was spectacular. The Riders also attended numerous walk-thrus, and it is an honor to attend these services. On 11 August about a dozen Riders took part in the annual Naperville India Day Parade. We are proud to be invited to ride in this parade to honor Naperville's India culture and people. We were the third group in the parade, following only a Naperville Police vehicle and fire truck. He is carrying a donation check for this fund in the amount of \$5000.00. The Riders previously donated \$1000.00 to this fund through the State of Illinois Legacy Run.







