COMMANDER'S CALL



I was invited to be a part of the city's 2020 census planning. I didn't know it, but many people don't get counted. Why should you get counted? There are several reasons but the top one is that you COUNT!

Preliminary numbers look like Illinois will lose at least one congressional seat. That is not good for Illinois because that means less representation at the big table. The districts will have to be redrawn also....and that should be a 'sporty' event.

Those decisions can affect the quality of your life and the lives of your loved ones, who also live in Illinois. According to our city government, that number is \$172 per person per year to Naperville.

It's October, and the count is not until April of 2020, but know that it is correct and right to properly be counted.


