Honoring our Fallen Veterans

Yes, we will again be placing Flags on our Veterans Gravesites prior to Memorial Day in Honor of their Service to our Country. We will start this on **Thursday, May 27**th. On that day we go to all our smaller cemeteries in the Naperville area and to our various Memorials. We will only need 5-6 helpers. If you can assist, please plan to meet at the VFW by 8:30am and we will proceed first to Big Woods and then to the rest.



On **Friday, May 28th,** please plan to be at St. Peter and Paul Cemetery no later than 9am so we can render honors to those Veterans interred at that Cemetery. Then on **Saturday, May 29th,** please plan to be at Naperville Cemetery by 9am so we can proceed with the flag placement there. We will do this rain or shine and can always use help. We currently have approximately 3,000 gravesites to place a flag. Thanks to Jim Hoch, all our Veteran Gravesites have been identified and are compiled by Cemetery Section's, so they are easy to use and to locate.

Then on Tuesday, June 1st, starting no later than 9am, we will be picking up all the flags starting at St. Peter and Paul and then to Naperville Cemetery. Please be sure to honor the Covid-19 Restrictions as we will be working in small groups, as in the past.



2021 Memorial Day Parade

Given the impact of the Covid-19 Virus we will be holding a scaled down version for this year's Memorial Day Parade on **Monday, May 31st**. As far as marching participants, it will be limited to Veterans, including our Combined Post Color Guard and Honor Guard, our Legion Riders and Scouts. We have asked our Scouts to carry the "13 Banners of our Naperville Fallen". As far as School Bands, we

are planning for up to 5 bands that will be positioned along Jackson Street and will musically honor our Veterans and our Naperville Fallen, as they pass by.

We are asking all Veterans that want to be in the Parade to be at the VFW no later than 8:30am. We will have 3 Trolleys there also to transport those Veterans that will need a ride. Here is the timetable and stops for the Parade and Memorial Services:

0900-Parade begins at the VFW at 908 W Jackson

0915-Arrival at Dandelion Fountain for the 1st Memorial Service. Once that is done, we will walk over to the Shanower Memorial.

0940-Memorial Service at the Shanower Memorial

0950-1130-Depart to Naperville Cemetery; Veterans Park; St. Peter and Paul Cemetery; The Doughboy and Sailor Memorial; Arrive at Central Park for the Concert.

1200-Memorial Day Ceremony and Service at the Bandshell.

1300-Luncheon at the VFW for Parade Participants

WE THANK YOU for your continued support of the American Legion Post 43.

I believe that we have turned the corner on the COVID-19 restrictions as vaccinations are continuing and restrictions are slowly being lifted. Our membership dues are tied to the Legion Fiscal Year and not the calendar year: Current fiscal year started July 1, 2020 and ends on June 30, 2021.

As of today, for this fiscal year, we are currently at 91% paid membership, or 528 members paid out of 580. Our goal is to be at 100% paid membership! So, what do we/you need to do as a team to reach this magic number.



May - June Dates in U.S. Military History

- On May 8, 1792, Congress passed the Militia Act, which required every free, able-bodied male citizen between the ages of 18 and 45 of the republic to serve in the U.S. Militia.
- The U.S. declared war on Great Britain on June 18, 1812, capping a series of hostile incidents over a number of years, principally the British assertion of a right to impress American seamen.
- The first engagement of the war with Mexico took place on May 8, 1846, at Palo Alto, Texas. Gen. Zachary Taylor defeated Gen Mariano Arista with American artillery providing the margin of victory.
- The highest casualty rate of any regiment during the Civil War was suffered on June 18, 1864. A Union regiment lost 652 out of 900 men in an unsuccessful attempt to take the Confederate city of Petersburg, VA
- Col. John J. Pershing sailed on May 29, 1917, from New York, leading the American Expeditionary Force in support of the Allies in WWI.
- On June 6, 1942, the Battle of Midway was fought between U.S. and Japanese naval and air forces. The U.S. victory is considered the turning point of WWII in the Pacific.
- The first hydrogen bomb was dropped on May 21, 1956, from a B-52 at an altitude of 50,000 feet over Bikini atoll in the Pacific.
- On June 17, 1965, the first mass bombing of the Vietnam War launched from Guam as part of Operation Arc Light. B-52 bombers attacked a Vietnamese troop concentration in Binduong Province.
- On May 10, 2005, a hand grenade was thrown at President George W. Bush as he spoke in Tbilisi, Georgia. The explosive landed 60' from the President, but failed to detonate.
- In Iraq on May 23, 2004, U.S. troops fought insurgents in Kufa, killing some 32 enemy fighters.
