

The other three were: "Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation", "Defense", and "Patriotism". At the Post 43 February dinner, it has become part of the history and tradition of this Post to acknowledge the



young men & women who have participated in sponsored events of the past year, and I anticipate that several (and some parents) will be our dinner guests on February 17.

Among the programs and events sponsored and underwritten by Post 43, are:

- -Annual Premier Boy's State at Eastern Illinois State University, in June
- -Annual Premier Girl's State at Eastern Illinois State University, in June
- -Sponsorship of Little League Baseball
- -Support for VFW National Home for Children at Eaton Rapids, Michigan
- -The American Legion Medallion and Certificate to an 8th grade boy and girl from each middle school, and a 12 grade boy and girl from each high school, selected by the faculty -Annual High School Oratorical Contest and Scholarship Awards
- -Participation in various school programs during Memorial Day week and Veteran's Day
- -Sponsorship of Boy Scout Troop 106, which has produced more than 65 Eagle Scouts

Additionally, students volunteer to upgrade, clean, plant and improve the grounds around the VFW Post in the spring, help at the VFW Fish Fry dinners during the Lenten Season, assist in the placement of veteran grave-marker flags (over 2300) prior to Memorial Day, and later removal.

Post 43 is honored to budget almost \$30,000 to support these activities, and look forward to seeing many of these young men and women at the February 17th dinner.

HAPPY 2018 TO ALL OUR VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES!

Don't forget to stay connected to God in prayer and to each other as we go about our busy lives. Speaking of our precious veterans, an article caught my attention over the

holidays concerning a homeless veteran in Pennsylvania. This story made several important observations about kindness, unselfishness and an unexpected encounter between two people that demonstrated the heart of our veterans and what they represent. A woman, who was so moved by her encounter with this homeless man, that it created a unique opportunity to give back and in so doing it changed her life forever! It seems Kate McClure was driving along a Philadelphia freeway to visit a friend when she ran out of gas. Fortunately, an unlikely hero came to her rescue. Johnny Bobbitt is a 34 year old North Carolina native who served in the Marine Corps and worked as a paramedic and firefighter according to his Facebook page. He told BBC Radio that bad decisions and situations had led him to homelessness. Bobbitt saw Kate pull over and sensing something was wrong approached Kate's car and immediately told her to get back into her vehicle and lock the doors. He returned later with her gas can filled with his last \$20. McClure made the decision to return the kindness by telling the veteran she would return with help. Later she returned with her boyfriend to visit Bobbitt. This time they brought money, warm clothing, food and more. However, this couple wanted to do more; much more as a response to Bobbitt's kindness.

They decided to contact a financial advisor, an attorney, and set up an online fundraiser with a Go Fund Me account so Johnny would have the means to assimilate back into a "normal" life. They also wanted to protect him by taking these steps: Two trust funds and a bank account were set up and, thanks to 14,000 donors, Johnny Bobbitt's act of kindness has raised more than \$390,000. That was enough to buy this veteran a new car and a new home. Lastly, an investment fund will allow Bobbitt's dream of owning some land and a cabin in the county a reality during retirement.

Did you notice that at no time in this story did our veteran ever ask anybody for help. Another great attribute of our veterans and of our homeless Marine is that he never felt sorry for himself or engaged in self-pity. He didn't blame the world for his circumstances. He took ownership over the bad decisions he had made previously that resulted in his homelessness. Lastly, Johnny Bobbitt was a compassionate man who was concerned about his fellow man, in this case a woman and knew Kate wanted to feel safe and secure by staying in the locked car. The end of this story has a happy ending. Even with all the turmoil going on today, when people really stop thinking and acting only for themselves and instead start thinking about another's best interest, can make a huge difference in someone's life. An act of kindness can also change their life forever, as well.

Now let me see! Could we try reaching out to each other a little more to help the other guy, and without expecting anything in return! I think most of us would agree that a simple act of kindness towards another next week can have positive life altering results in daring to lower our guard in order that another can feel compassion and love.



- 4. Enter your e-mail address and create a personal password.
- 5. You will be given 3 choices:
 - Add to timeline

 - Add an upcoming event
- 6. After making your choice, just fill in the blanks. It will ask what format you want HTML or Plain Text. HTML is a computer language using a code to help format the write-up. For those unfamiliar with HTML, just select Plain Text and format as usual.
- 7. When you get to the bottom of the page click save.
- 8. The Post 43 Administrators of the site will then be able to edit and make any corrections necessary. Then your entry will be visible on the site.

Premier Boys State will be held from **June 9 - 15**, **2018** and Illini Girls State will be held from **June 17 - 23**, **2018** at Eastern Illinois University in Charleston, Illinois.

Boys and Girls State are seven-day hands on experiences in the operation and fundamentals of government. These Programs bring together the best and brightest high school students – during the summer before their senior years – to help lead them down the path of individual success and leadership through doing, not just learning.

Post 43 Twelfth Annual Middle/Junior High School Speech Contest

The 2018 contest will begin at 10:00 AM on Saturday, April 14, 2018 on the second floor of the Legion Hall at 10 West Chicago Av. in Naperville. Contestants must be in the 7^{th} or 8^{th} grades.

They will speak for from four to six minutes on some aspect of the Constitution of the United States. Judging is based on content and speaking skill. Participants gain a better knowledge of the constitution, a chance to hone their speaking skills in front of an audience, cash prizes of \$125, \$75 and \$50 for $1^{\rm st}$, $2^{\rm nd}$ and $3^{\rm rd}$ place respectively – each participant will receive at least \$25, and valuable experience should they elect to compete as a high school student in the Legion's Constitutional Oratorical Contest.



In the past ten years Naperville's contestants in that contest have done very well, many having progressed through county, district, and division contests to compete at state. Two have gone on to place second and third at the national contest in Indianapolis. College Scholarships awarded at the Illinois contest total \$13,000 and at National \$130,000, Quite an incentive for the students and their parents.

You can be a part of the audience or help with one of the many (easy) tasks necessary to stage the contest. What's in it for you? I'll bet you will learn something about the Constitution, you'll be supporting our local youth and I'll bet you will be very impressed with these kids. And it only costs you a couple hours; no long term obligation involved. Contact me or just show up on Saturday April 8. Bring a friend. And be sure that all eligible children, nieces, nephews, grandchildren, friends and neighbors are aware so they have chance to enter the contest.



2018 SCHOLARSHIP AWARD INCREASED TO \$5000

Purpose

American Legion Post 43, Naperville, in order to assist a deserving young man or woman pursue their education after high school, will award a graduate of the class of 2018 from an accredited Illinois high school a scholarship of up **to \$5000.00**, to paid directly to any tech-

nical school or degree granting college or university within the United States, upon confirmation of enrollment.

Eligibility

- Resident of Illinois who is currently a senior in high school in the class of 2018 and
- Child, stepchild or grandchild or great grandchild of a member of Naperville American Legion Post 43, Chapter 43 Legion Riders, or Sons of the Legion Squadron 43
- Or currently a member of Boy Scout Troop 106, or The Ghostriders Sea Cadet VF-142 Squadron, or was a High School Oratorical Contest participant or attended Illinois Boys/Girls State under the sponsorship of Naperville American Legion Post 43
- Or **NEW THIS YEAR**: The child of a Naperville military veteran who, while a resident and on active duty, was killed or suffered a disability of 50% or more as determined by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs

Selection Criteria

- Academic achievement (GPA: high school transcript required)
- Leadership and participation in school and/or community activities
- Honors,
- Community Service
- Patriotic Involvement
- Student essay describing the responsibilities of citizenship in a democratic society. The essay shall be the original work of the student. Any other material must be footnoted. The essay shall not be longer than three typed pages, and will be formatted with one-inch margins, 1.5 line spacing and 12-point font.
- The grading of this essay will be based on grammar, spelling, originality, context and content at a level consistent with exceptional high school work.

Applying for the Award

Send all required material and supporting documentation to American Legion Post #43, P.O. Box 4, Naperville, IL 60566, Attention: Scholarship Committee. Please include your name, address, phone number & email address for contact information. Applications must be received by March 27, 2018.

The decision of the Scholarship Committee Judges is final and all applicants will receive written notification that a decision has been reached. The winner will be notified by telephone and presentation of this award will take place on the evening of April 21, 2018 at the American Legion Awards and Recognition Banquet.

Naperville is blessed with people who serve their fellow citizens. Typically, the judges have a very difficult task. Comprehensive information, attachments and endorsements may be included, are of great help to them in selecting the winners. They may be mailed to American Legion Post 43, Citizen of the Year, Post Office Box 4, Naperville, 60566 or emailed to vahlei@comcast.net to arrive by March 27, 2018.

Winners will be announced in the local media and honored at the Legion's Awards and Recognition Banquet on April 21, 2018.
