

On Saturday, March 4th, I was again at the Peoria Civic Center to witness the annual American Legion Department of Illinois Oratorical Contest for High School students. Wayne Fischer had already gone the day before to be readied as one of the moderators. I'm proud and happy to report that our Post 43, for the 6th time since 2005, has claimed the state speaking champion in the person of Central High School Junior, Ryan Park. Don Hennessy has administered this program for Post 43 for several years.



Ryan was one of four participants who represented Naperville, and there were a total of 25 speakers from all around the state. The others: Regan Macwan, Nicole Tong, and Shivansh Gupta all performed exceptionally. These students were also our guests on "youth night" at the February Legion dinner.

These youngsters typically do wonderful, and especially when one considers the strict rules under which they must perform: 1) the speech must be the individual's own composition, and about some aspect of the Constitution; 2) it must be at least 8 minutes in length, but not more than 10 minutes, or be penalized; 3) the moderator makes the introduction by speech title only; 4) it must be memorized, no notes or props; 5) no mike or amplification can be used; 6) there shall be no applause or photography, and each speaker is not allowed to listen to any of the others.

After they have all delivered their individual speeches and the judges have had an opportunity to compile their notes, a sealed envelope is opened and a constitutional amendment is made known. Each participant is then allowed 5 minutes to prepare a speaking response of between 3 and 5 minutes, and they are all called back to the room one at a time. The semi-finals are then complete and 5 winners are selected. The finals take place in the afternoon with the same basic rules applied, but with a different constitutional amendment being drawn.

Ryan was awarded a \$2000 scholarship for his win. He will now advance to the national contest on April 22-23 in Indianapolis, where candidates from all 50 states, Wash DC, France, Puerto Rico, and Mexico will compete. Some of us will be there for support.

Fellow Comrades, Legionnaires, and Post 43 Family:

NOTES
Four months into 2017, and it seems this will not be a normal year! February was the third warmest in 140 years and both

January and February were the least snowiest ever. Can you believe not even one inch of snow fell in both months combined. Imagine that! So what's next, winter in May?

Many of you have read about, or observed, others talking about practicing spiritual principles or sharing one's personal faith. The topic is getting discussed by many of us along with the new political landscape in Washington. For the next several issues of "Keeping Posted" we will examine how our faith plays such an important role in our daily lives and in our values. In taking a deeper look many of you will be challenged as I will be to self-examine myself. We will, I think, be encouraged and even surprised by what we discover about the importance of understanding the vital role faith plays and why we should not shirk from sharing our faith with others.

First, God's word is crystal clear about faith. He says it is impossible to please him without having faith. Also, faith without being placed into action (works) is dead or bears no fruit. Now, think about those times that your faith was tested. What action did you take in stepping into the unknown trusting yourself and God! Chapter 11 of the Book of Hebrews gives us the heroes of faith from the Bible. These were ordinary men and women with all their faults and fears who demonstrated extraordinary acts of faith despite facing and enduring criticism, persecution, resentment, suffering and even death.

Now, I know what many of you are saying. I don't want to 'force' my faith, spirituality or religious views on anyone! They may get angry, never talk to me again or be offended or tell others. I just can't get myself to share my faith. I just want to go along to get along. Leave this faith business to others better equipped. Maybe your reaction to sharing your faith is more that you feel you are too quiet and would not know what to say. Well here is something to reassure all of you. We ALL have felt that way more often then not. Finding ourselves in situations to share our faith but felt awkward, ill-equipped and not confident. We say it's too risky to share this with others. So, how can we share confidently and comfortably our faith? How do we overcome our shortcomings and fears? The answer may surprise you! Just be yourself! Speak from your heart and speak in your own words. Share a story, perhaps of how a friend shared their faith with you to get you through a challenge or tragedy. Tell a story! Share how your personal faith was strengthened during a difficult period or in a critical situation. Ask God to give you the courage as you speak from your heart. This will become easier because you've lived through it. God will give you the right words; just be yourself! Also, seek out other faith-minded people through various organizations or your church. Then watch what a blessing you become to others as they draw strength from your story and faith. We step out in our own faith to give God the Glory and to help others. Those are the main reasons we should always try to share our faith. God has given you and I a precious gift!

As President Ronald Reagan stated in his inaugural address: "If not me then who? If not now then when?" God Bless all of you this special holiday season!
